# THE PRESENT CONTINUOUS TENSE

## INTERROGATIVE: Play

Am	I	playing?
Are	you we they	
Is	he she it	

## NEGATIVE: Play

I	am not 'm not	playing
You We They	are not aren't	
He She It	is not isn't	

# THE PRESENT CONTINUOUS TENSE



Is he **playing** football at the moment?  
No, he isn't. He **is running**.

Ending IE=	<del>-I</del> +Y+ing	Ending E=	<del>-E</del> +ing	Ending CVC	=CVCC
Die	Dying	Delete	Deleting	Run	Running
Lie	Lying	Compete	Competing	Stop	Stopping
Ending Syllable(-)+CVC(+)	=CVCC+ing	Ending Syllable(+)+CVC(-)	=CVC+ing		
Reffer	Reffering	Happen	Happening		
Omit	Omitting	Open	Opening

Yesterday it was very sunny.

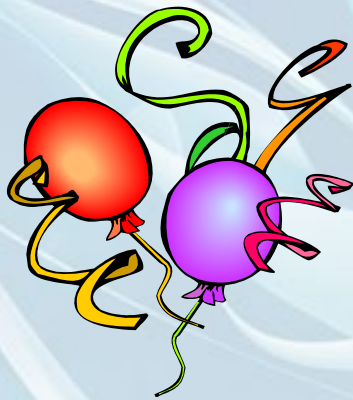


Today it's raining more and more.
